## Lifesavers' Efforts Help to Decrease Rescues



Victorian lifesavers' and lifeguards' efforts in preventing incidents occurring have helped reduce the number of rescues required in the 2014/15 lifesaving season.

At the conclusion of lifesaving patrols for the 2014/15 season on Sunday 12 April, lifesavers and lifeguards had performed a total of 113,306 preventative actions, 22,856 more than last season. This season also saw a decrease in rescues, with 500 rescues performed, compared to 513 last year.

Lifesavers and lifeguards treated 1688 first aid cases, while an estimated 2.6 million people visited patrolled beaches throughout the season.

Manager Lifesaving Operations Greg Scott says that although this summer's cooler weather saw fewer beach visitors, lifesavers' and lifeguards' increased proactive efforts have shown a positive effect in helping to ensure the safety of beachgoers.

"Preventative actions can include providing beach safety information to first timers, taking time to talk to beach patrons about the local hazards and conditions, and letting people know if they are about to enter the water in a potentially dangerous area, such as near a rip current," said Mr Scott.

"Although our lifesavers train to perform rescues and take action should it be required, ideally, we like to prevent the situation eventuating in the first place and it is great to see that this is occurring more and more frequently.

"Our volunteer lifesavers and paid lifeguards have again done a fantastic job in ensuring the safety of people at Victorian beaches and I thank them for their dedication in looking out for beachgoers throughout the season. With the red and yellow flags packed away for winter, Mr Scott advises those visiting the beach to take extra care.

"Drowning incidents happen all year round, not just in summer. There were 47 drowning deaths in 2013/14 and from 1 July 2014 to 31 March 2015, 31 people have already lost their lives in the water in Victoria alone.

"Take responsibility for your own safety by ensuring you understand the conditions, and have adequate safety equipment and the necessary skills for your activity. Most importantly, whatever your activity around or on the water, never head out alone." Lifesaving patrols will recommence for next season from mid November 2015.

# Presidents Report

## Season 2014 - 2015



After securing the State and Local Government funding - as well as dipping into the club's finances, we finally have our new building which we should be very proud of. Yes, the project did have a few delays, due to a variety of different issues, so the completion date was pushed back from season start to ultimately season completion. Nobody was more frustrated by this than myself as it was me that had to keep delivering the change of completion date to the club's membership. It was quite embarrassing at times and although it's not my fault, I feel that I must extend my apologies to all members for these delays. Take away the delays and the build was only a week over the expected time line and with only a 1.5% overspend, which is almost unheard of in construction terms these days, everyone involved in the project has done an amazing job to bring home the project almost on budget.

Bringing the building home on budget means that the club has not had to approach any financial institution for funding to complete the works. However, club funds are quite low at present, so we still have to be very careful how we move forward with our expenditure over the next few years. Having tipped in so much of our own money on a building that we do not own, but have to maintain is very frustrating, but that is the way the shire works for all Life Saving Clubs on the Peninsula. With that in mind we must ensure that we treat the building with respect and thoughtfulness as if it was our own home. This will be an education process for some, but one we must always push so that the club's funds are not being constantly accessed on building up keep. I ask that everyone please keep this in mind when accessing the new facility. Thank you in advance.

This year's sponsors have again been amazing with their support to the whole club and have been very patient with use during the build process. As a club on several levels we failed to live up to some of our commitments to a couple of our

dedicated and loyal supporters. For these we are truly sorry and we hope that this doesn't affect our relationship for the coming season. I have spoken to most of the sponsors personally to discuss what went wrong and how we can improve with our commitment to them in the future. Without our sponsors support, we the club, would not be able to provide the equipment for the programs that we run, as well as extra patrol gear for our primary role to the community and beach goers.

Patrols this year were outstanding, given that we were all thrust with the extra work in set up and pack up and not having any building just a tent to conduct the patrols from. All Patrollers need to be recognised for their outstanding efforts. At the end of last season we were faced with the possibility of losing a patrol team, but thanks to a dedicated group, we were able to retain a seventh team made up of members from other teams and some new Bronze and SRC members. Tara Jackson stepped up to the plate and became team 7's Patrol Captain. During the season 2 patrol audits were conducted by Life Saving Victoria and team 7 were lucky enough to get both audits. Considering the lack of years of experience they did an outstanding job and if not for a pedantic assessor they could have scored maximum points - a fantastic effort by all. The club is currently looking for more Nipper parents to become patrol members, as we are looking to put on a team dedicated to the Nipper program which could also possibly assist at carnivals with water safety on a rotation basis. It is by far the best place to watch your kids from if they compete. Currently we are training 6 new Bronzes - all Nipper parents, and by the time this goes to publication they should be qualified which is a great result and a great start to getting more parents involved. Mornington LSC has put in place that if your child wants to compete at carnivals you have to become a patrolling member or obtain an official's qualification. I'm not sure how that ended up working for them but if it worked well MMLSC might have to introduce a similar policy. So, if you are given

the chance to do your Bronze get on the front foot and make sure that your kids are not disappointed in seasons to come.

Peter Johnstone and the Nipper Sub Committee were able to run a great program again this season, much credit to all involved. Great weather each week - bar one, meant that the program was not really compromised without the building. However, Friday nights still had a strange feel about them. Not being able to go upstairs and have a meal after nippers, the pack up and go home just didn't feel right all the same. It highlight though how little we used the old building for the Nipper program itself. Comps for the Nippers were somewhat interesting this year with a lot of waiting around and plenty of people having their say with LSV and how they need to improve the way they run the carnivals. Regional's was a disaster and was quite embarrassing for LSV - thankfully it was all sorted out just before State Titles. Mt Martha Nippers had some excellent results at States and all should be very proud of their efforts. Ten of the young ladies from the under 14s became the first members for Mt Martha's R&R teams. Five young ladies formed each team and they competed at Seniors carnivals in this event. Both teams had great success throughout the season, travelling to Sydney for two carnivals with tremendous results and then on to represent Mt Martha LSC at the first youth Australian Championships at Nth Kirra, Queensland where Blue team came away with an Australian bronze medal and green team finished a very close 6<sup>th</sup>. All young ladies need to be congratulated and they in turn pass on their thanks to Geoff Waters their coach, who in such a short time frame instructed the girls and was able to get them to produce the effort they did all season long. Geoff, thanks for giving these girls the opportunity to excel the way they have.

Seniors have again enjoyed a very successful season with outstanding results across the board, both in the water and on the beach. Training numbers were down, but that followed the same pattern as Nippers. Jane Cole and her team of coaches and helpers put together a different program this season, which was more participation based and was a great deal of fun for all involved. Unfortunately as the season progressed there was a bit of a participation drop off - something that can be addressed next season. Senior states went really well with all team members returning with a medal, which is close to a first. The water boys did an amazing job on the skis and boards with Rhys Cole collecting the gold in the board race. The boys followed up their great results at states to make the final of the U17 ski rely at Nationals where they gave it their all and did the club and themselves very proud. The sand team was the smallest for many years, but all members did a great job and can hold their heads high with the effort that they put into the competition. All Senior competition team members put the duty of the club ahead of anything else, making sure that they patrolled when required and helped out with several club programs throughout the season. As did the majority of the remaining Seniors who do not want to participate in competition. It is great to see the Seniors taking their roles within the club seriously as our Nippers really do look up them and identify with all aspects of what becoming a Senior means.



Masters has again been such a fun group to be part of, each year new members start up in the Masters program and form new friendships through out the community. If you ever want to join in just come down to the club during daylight saving time on Wednesday evenings 6-00 to 7-30 and become part of the crew. Doctor Scott Fifield runs the show and looks after us – it is really comforting to know that there is a doctor close by! As for the Masters State titles, this year we fell two points short of winning for the seventh year running. This was sad but with squad numbers down we knew we were going to be up against it from the outset. Our narrow loss was at the hands of Mordialloc LSC where I have a load of friends, so it was kind of nice that they beat us, not a surf club. Jane Cole and Caroline McGill went on to compete at Aussies and both collected bronze medals - great effort ladies. The fire is in the belly now to try and win the States title back next season, so let's hope we have a large team that are happy to just try their best win, lose, or draw.

Again this years MMAD Swim day was a huge success with huge numbers in attendance. Logistically the day ran well as the MMAD Swim team had got right onto it early and were really prepared for the day's events. Andrew Felsingher had his team primed and ready to go for all elements of the day. The first MMLSC Highway Collection was compromised by a council and police error. Unfortunately two organizations were given permission to conduct collection on the same day. We average around \$10,000-00 at each collection but took a massive hit on the day collecting only about half our average, this was incredibly frustrating for Leanne Jack, but she handled the situation really well and got everything sorted for the next collection which was back to our average total. My thanks goes out to all members who helped out at both the Highway Collections and the MMAD Swim, without your assistance the events would not be the success they have been again this season.

Many thanks to all members of the Executive Committee, General committee and all the other Sub committees for your support over the past 12 months, I believe that we have worked really well together and have done our best to help improve the club and its processes, thanks all.

I would also like to thank all members for their patience this season and sincerely apologise for any inconvenience that you may have been caused due to the extended building process. I do believe however, that with the final result in, we now offer a fantastic facility and that we should all look forward to enjoying this facility for many years to come.

Finally, to my family, it's been a very trying second half of the season as you are more than aware, I cannot thank you enough for all your continued support - I love you all.

This figure can be considered to be inflated due to some building expenses due to the size in \$ terms had to be classified as fixed assets. MMLSC's Balance sheet continue to grow with the acquisition of new assets including a new IRB & road trailer, rescue boards and 1<sup>st</sup> instalment for the new club rooms.

Memberships income managed to increase despite reduced membership numbers due to the new building levy.

The Merchandise team lead by Maria Harvey in conjunction with Sarah Magee set up an online shop so members can make their purchases at home and pick up at the club, making it more convenient and saving member's time.

# Patrol Captains Report 2014 - 2015

**“The primary function of Mount Martha Life Saving Club is to provide beach patrols during the summer period – without providing these services we cease to exist.”**



Well, that was a fast season – 21 weeks, 63 patrols, 166 members who patrolled, 3,900 patrol hours.

Firstly a huge thank you to all our Patrol Captains, Vice-Captains and Patrol Members who patrolled this season without a clubhouse. Considering we were operating out of a shed in the Yacht Club you all did a fantastic job. Whether it was minor first aids, Nipper nights or performing rescues it was all done willingly, professionally and with care. You are all an enormous credit to yourselves and the club.

As mentioned, we patrolled from Mount Martha Yacht Club this year and I would like to formally thank Commodore Stuart and his committee for their generous offer of these facilities and everything else they helped us with throughout the season.

During the year we welcomed 43 new patrolling members to our 7 patrol teams. Considering we did not have a clubhouse or chief instructor, Pam Mowat has done an amazing job getting these new Bronze and SRC's qualified and ready to patrol. We also had members up skill throughout the season and added 10 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, 6 Senior First Aid, 3 Inflatable Rescue Boat Crew, 3 Inflatable Rescue Boat Drivers and 11 Spinal Management. Again, without a clubhouse or chief instructor this is an amazing achievement as these awards are crucial in allowing us to run patrols that are manned by members with the correct awards. Thanks to Bree Ambry and all the other assessors within the district that assisted with the assessment of our patrol members.

We would love to see as many patrolling members as possible up skill over the winter months. There will be courses run for IRB, ART, First Aid, BBM & Spinal Management and these provide fantastic opportunities to increase your personal skill levels and will take place in a state of the art training facility – our new club! Even if it is just one extra award that you gain each season, it makes a massive difference to the strength of each Patrol Team and our Club.

Assistant Patrol Captains Rhys Cole and Hannah Mowat have done a great job this year stepping up into their first leadership positions within the club and ensuring all our patrol logs are accurately recorded into Surfguard on time. Thanks for all your help.

As the heading to this report states our core purpose is to provide beach patrols during the summer period. In addition to this we require qualified life savers to provide water safety at Nippers and to meet our Carnival Water Safety requirements when your children compete at local, state and national events. To be able to achieve these commitments in the future we need more members to gain a qualification. The more members that become qualified the less everyone has to do – let's spread the load! This year we had 690 members eligible to obtain an award and patrol, of these only 166 members completed a patrol. That means we have a potential member base of over 500 that could obtain an award and patrol. Our stated objectives over the coming two seasons is to add an 8<sup>th</sup> patrol team and have a dedicated Friday night patrol team. To be able to achieve these objectives we need as many eligible members as possible to consider gaining an award.

If we are able to add an 8<sup>th</sup> Patrol Team it means all patrolling members will have to patrol less during the summer, making it much easier for everyone involved.

If we are able to add a dedicated Friday Night Patrol it means you can get involved with your children in a fun and exciting activity and also means patrol teams will have less rostered patrols.

The Executive and the Patrol Sub-Committee would call on the parents of Nippers and Seniors, new and existing members – regardless of your experience or ability to come along to one of our Life Saving courses and gain a skill for life. Life Saving not only provides a very healthy lifestyle and a wonderful community service, you will also gain valuable skills for the home, workplace and everyday life.

Thanks again to all our patrol members for keeping the public safe at our beach, I look forward to another successful season next year.

Prior to starting the season, we had our gear inspections by the District Supervisors, which highlighted several defects with the IRB's that needed urgent attention. All boat's were immediately put in for their annual servicing and repairs, including all three motors, which required certifying and signing off as sufficient as required by LSV. All boats (bar one) were put into service on the beach during the year. The one that we didn't use has a defective internal bladder, so unfortunately that one is beyond repair for our purposes and out of serviceability for good so, it's gone to God!

During the season the boats were used at every patrol and also (as required) transported to and from various Carnivals as needed. IRB Patrol Log's were in the "Most Part", filled out as required, but there are still some people who seem to be breezing through the checklists without proper scrutiny of the boat(s) prior to packing them away.

But overall, a great effort by those that did take the time to check things properly. Also, cleaning of the boats and motors was a bit of a concern by some Patrols at the end of shifts. Several times during the season, I did observe that the boats were put away covered in sand, as were the motors. The weekend shifts can be long and arduous, especially on the really hot days and the few "Rainy Shockers" that we did have, but it is paramount that the boats are put away cleaned properly and ready for the next Patrol. The starting of engines at the start of shifts is always a bit of "Huffing and Puffing" along with an amount of sweat, so proper cleaning will alleviate some of this? It has been hard this year because of the club conditions and build, I know.

I am currently working with the Club Board on the "Wish List" for the IRB's for next season. The main objective, as far as I am concerned, is finding a new home for the IRB's (in the building) once the Club is set up properly. We are working hard on the "Wish list" and one of mine will be IRB storage of Boats, Motors and Equipment, so watch this space and hopefully my/our wishes will come true? Overall a great effort from everybody and onwards and upwards for the Club and the IRB Department...

Thank you to everyone for helping out each Friday night, your help and support is very much appreciated. I couldn't have done my job without you. Yes, everything was made harder by lack of clubhouse and yes everything looked a bit chaotic at times, but we were organised and raring to go each Friday night by 6pm and I must say I quite enjoyed being down on the beach on the front line of everything MMLSC Nippers.

Despite having no clubhouse MMLSC Nippers had yet another enjoyable and successful season. We had 435 Nippers registered, with 276 Nippers passing their S badge and 76 Nippers successfully completing their competition swim. Our busiest night was 21<sup>st</sup> November with 316 Nippers on the beach and our quietest night was 19<sup>th</sup> December with 198 Nippers on the beach. The weather held out for us for all set Fridays bar 1 on the 9<sup>th</sup> January which was cancelled due to local storms.

As with season 2013/14 we appointed extra Age Managers and Assistants in the U6 – U9 to help manage the large number of Nippers in these groups. With limited facilities, beach set-up was a little more complex than previous years, so we rostered on an age group each week to assist with this. This worked extremely well and we are looking to carry this initiative on into season 2015/16.

## JUNIOR COMPETITION REPORT 2014 - 2015



This season saw teams compete at 5 Nippers carnivals, plus regional qualifier and state titles. 10 of our dedicated U14 girls who competed in R and R for the first time, also competed at another 10 seniors carnivals, including 2 in Sydney and the Aussies (National Championships) in Queensland.

Nippers were treated with a variety of conditions over the summer, from lightning storms at Mordialloc in December, extreme heat at Cosy corner in early January to large waves, which many had not competed in before, at the state titles in Warrnambool, with the added bonus of competing at 3 different locations for the regional qualifiers in Waratah Bay.

Despite not having club rooms, and the associated problems this brought with finding gear, retrieving the trailer etc, we were still able to get pretty good numbers to most carnivals with everyone that attended having fun and trying their hardest.

This year saw the introduction of pre-drawn heats for all carnivals, which meant that in most cases, we were able to get off the beach earlier than last year – a good thing when faced with several hours driving in a lot of cases.

While the overall number of competitors were similar to last year, there were a lot of times that some kids were unable to compete in team events due to lack of numbers and spent a lot of time sitting around doing nothing. We hope to improve on that for next year's competitions.

A special thanks to all the water safety and officials who attended the carnivals. Without you the Nippers would not be able to compete.

### **Carnival 1 – Mordialloc 6<sup>th</sup> December 2014**

Driving up to Mordialloc, the 31 competitors were confronted by a rather large lightning storm which lead to the carnival being delayed while a decision was made to compete or not. After waiting an hour we went ahead in cold and windy conditions and an under 10's water course that ended up being further than the under 14's.

### **Carnival 2 - Cosy Corner (Torquay) 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2015**

A team of 39 Nippers encountered pretty flat conditions and a really hot 35 degree day plus a plague of little flies in the afternoon, which meant everyone was keen to escape from the beach quickly on completion.

We came home with one 1<sup>st</sup>, two 2<sup>nd</sup> and six 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbons.

### **Carnival 3 – Chelsea 17<sup>th</sup> January 2015**

Due to the regional qualifiers being held the next day, the bulk of the team did not compete, but 4 hardy souls competed in very windy conditions.



## Carnival 4 – Regionals Waratah Bay 18<sup>th</sup> January 2015

48 Nippers with their families in tow, headed down to Waratah Bay to be met by big messy surf plus cold and wind. This meant that the carnival was moved not once, but twice during the day. Unfortunately many events were not finished due to these relocations, and a ballot system was used a few weeks later to identify States qualifiers in those events – all in all not one of the more enjoyable carnivals unfortunately, but all part of the learning experience for all.

This year we also competed as a combined region with the Eastern region, so qualifying was particularly difficult in some events with the larger numbers. Some individual events were also pre-qualified for the first time due to the numbers involved.

## Carnival 5 – Ocean Grove 8<sup>th</sup> February 2015

Once again we were greeted with cold, rainy, windy and difficult surf conditions (particularly for the younger competitors) which made life a bit unpleasant for the 43 wet competitors.

We came home with two 1<sup>st</sup>, seven 2<sup>nd</sup> and four 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbons plus a couple of sore heads from being hit by flying boards

## Carnival 6 – Lorne 21<sup>st</sup> February 2015

32 Nippers made yet another trek down the west coast to be greeted by warm conditions and a small to medium surf lead to a nice carnival for most, and we were all finished and packed just as a storm arrived.

We came home with one 1<sup>st</sup>, one 2<sup>nd</sup> and seven 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbons

## Carnival 7 – State Titles Warrnambool 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> March 2015

Once again the State titles were held in Warrnambool, with many families making the transition to tent city at the caravan parks.

Cool conditions and clean but large waves greeted the 46 kids who competed on both days of the carnival, with many having to brave surf of this size for the first time – a fantastic effort from all those who competed.

Gold medals were won by our March past team, U/14 girls belt & Reel, U/13 boys belt & Reel.

Silver medals were won by the U/14 boys Belt & Reel and in flags.

We also had 17 teams or individuals qualified for finals.

## R and R

5 person Rescue and Resuscitation is a traditional event in (Seniors only) lifesaving carnivals, however it's popularity has declined over the years with the arrival of boards, skis and powered water craft.

The club had 2 teams compete at all carnivals including the state titles and regional qualifiers, major carnivals at Manly and Freshwater in Sydney in January and the Aussies in April at Kirra beach.

The girls, their coach, manager and parents all put in a huge commitment to this process including many extra hours of training right through the winter, and even though they were competing against more experienced under 15 teams, were able to finish third and sixth at the national titles – an amazing effort for first year competitors.

Many thanks to Emma for organising and managing the teams at the carnivals and all the associated accommodation and travel arrangements that she organised.



With no club to train out of, the Seniors have had a very successful and enjoyable year. Thursday nights Fun Nights went down a storm. We had a team orienteering night, Peninsula Obstacle course night, Beep Test evening, attempted Board Chariot races, team beach and water events plus more, finishing the season with a great evening at Volpino. Lots of laughter and fun had by all.

Season 2014/15 saw the Seniors with 7 Carnivals, starting mid December at Bancoora through to finishing at Vic Comps in mid March at Torquay.

On March 28<sup>th</sup>/29<sup>th</sup> our Seniors competed in the Victorian Life Saving Championships at Ocean Grove. Outstanding results from all - including our U17 boys Rhys Cole, Matt Graves and Lachie Lloyd finishing with a silver medal in the U17 Ski Relay. Rhys Cole is also a State Champion winning Gold in the U17 Board. Our 2 R&R Teams came home with Gold and Silver and the U17 Men's Beach Relay team came home with Silver. Callen Goldsmith is a State Champion with a Gold medal in the U17 2km Run with Dylan Burrows grabbing himself a Bronze medal in the same race. Georgia Carter sprinted to a Bronze medal in the U17 Beach Sprint, Ellie-May Maguire-Harvey a Bronze medal in the U19 Flags and the Women's U19 Beach Relay raced to a fantastic Silver medal. Not only did the Seniors achieve fantastic results at the State Championship, but every Senior competing came home with a medal!!!

Aussies was held this year at Kirra Beach in Queensland, between April 9<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup>. Our R&R Girls team B won a Bronze medal with team A finishing 6<sup>th</sup>. Fantastic effort Girls. All your training was certainly rewarded by your outstanding results. Our u17 Boys also made the Ski Relay final which was an amazing effort. Those 4.30am morning training sessions before school and endless afternoons of training certainly paid off.

Seniors this year would not have been as manageable and as successful as it has been without the help and assistance from Cameron and Caroline, John, Tanya and Leigh and Shane. Especial thanks to Cameron and Caroline McGill. I can't thank you both enough.


A BIG thank you must also go to Margi Carter for her Senior Manager role, organising, registering and booking events.


