## President Report

Once again I can't quite believe it is time to sit down and compile my review for the annual report. I thought last year was fast but this really has been a quick year, with so much achieved by so many.

I am really proud of the patrolling members within our club as without this vital volunteer service we would not have the benefit of all the other areas within the club. This season we had over 160 members attend a rostered patrol and I would like to thank them all for volunteering their time. In respect of the building I am so pleased **that the major fit work has been completed. We completed the installation of the three barbeques and it's** pleasing to see they are being well used by Nippers, on patrol, masters and club members in general. As the beach is getting busier we have erected some signage to inform the public that our clubhouse is for members only along with directions to the public toilets. We felt this was necessary as many visitors to the beach were coming into the club to use our facilities, including the showers. We have completed the cabinetry in the **downstairs patrol room, shelving in the cupboard in the function room and shelved the cleaners' cupboard. We installed racking for our SUP's in the general gear area and they have been getting great use.** During the off season our focus will be on rectifying the lack of sand at the beach side which is causing a large drop off to the beach. We have already engaged the Shire and are hopeful this will be completed before the start of next season. I would like to thank all involved in maintain the building but in particular Steve "The Hof" Hofer, Keith Hunter and Nick Wootton who have been driving the building activity. We plan to continue with three working bees per year to help maintain the high standard of our clubhouse. "The Hof" has compiled a list of maintenance activities to be completed at each working bee so it would be good if more members could turn up and support this next season.

On the management side of the club we have continued with our plans to ensure we perform our activities in a professional manner and comply with all governance expected of us. We have moved almost all our employees onto our payroll with just one club area to go. We applied for an extension to our liquor license so we were legally able to sell alcohol on a Sunday afternoon. This will be a great benefit for private club hire. We also applied for a liquor license extension for the club Christmas party which allows us to consume alcohol on the beach. I am pleased that all these activities we undertake reduce risk to our club. Financially we are in a good position and we began our equipment purchase plan with new Nipper boards, Mals and Stand Up Paddle Boards. It is our plan to purchase some craft every year and ensure we have the best possible equipment for our members. We secured funding for a new ATV and rescue boards. The new ATV will allow us to safely transport up to six patrol members to incidents on the beach. We supported some of our younger members to attend U13 and U15 leadership development camps held by LSV. We view this as an investment in the future leaders of the club. During the off season we are planning to upgrade the website and should have a more user friendly and functional site by the start of the season. This season we partnered with The Coastal Kitchen to run the canteen and I believe this has been a huge success. Their healthy menu, great coffee and friendly service has been well received by members, the local community and visitors alike. I can't wait to have more brekky burritos on patrol next year!

The Nippers area of the club has had a great year this year. I'd like to thank Bec, the junior sub-committee, all age managers and coaches for pulling together a great program each week. Friday dinners, the bar and movie night all add to the program and provided a great social opportunity for all members, not just Nipper parents. I'm sure next year will see us grow again as word spreads throughout Mount Martha. Our Starfish Nipper program had another great year with more participants and wasn't it great to see Tin Tin sing the national anthem at the MMAD Swim - brilliant job Tin Tin.

I have been really pleased to see the growth and participation in the senior section of the club. We have had a few quiet years but the plans put in place by Jon, Lisa and Shane are paying off. It's great to see our seniors returning to competition and winning pennants and medals. Well done to Troy and Shane for all the coaching and encouragement given to the Seniors this year.

Masters had a great year and narrowly missed out on a top three finish at the state championships. I know next year they will go one better and finish top three. Masters is an area of the club for our adult members to participate - it's not about training at the top level it's about going at your own pace and developing skills in your own time. The social aspect of Masters has really developed with most Wednesday night training sessions followed by a get together.

As a fair weathered Iceberger it is great to see that they keep going from strength to strength with more hardy souls joining each year. Cold water swimming is actually quite beneficial but should be undertaken with experienced swimmers and there is no better group than the MMLSC Icebergers. If you would like to give it a go make sure you get in touch with Kaye before June.

An area of the club that has grown this year, but not many know about, is our Schools Program. During school terms 1 and 4 we provide beach and water safety educational programs for local schools. Over the years we have educated thousands of kids in water safety and I'm delighted that our program continues to grow and develop. Thanks to Leah Andrews and her team of lifeguards for providing a very professional and successful service.

Last year we partnered with the Shire to provide beach matting allowing all abilities access to the water. I'm pleased that this was such a success that we have signed an agreement to provide this service for the next three years.

Additionally we now have two mobi chairs which allow people in wheelchairs the opportunity to get into the water. The matting is a huge success and the highest amount of calls we receive at the club is enquiring about the availability of the matting. This year we made the matting available at the beach for some organisations to use. The scouts had a disabled troop use it in January, Corowa Court Aged Care used it a couple of times for their residents to visit the beach as well as groups from Camp Manyung and Peninsula Specialist College and they all just loved it. I would like to thank our Icebergers and Schools Program lifeguards for their assistance in putting out and packing up the matting for these sessions

In February the Shire provided us with the opportunity to show a short version of the Plastic Ocean movie. We combined this with a talk from BERG and the Dolphin Research Institute about the ecology and wildlife in the bay. We finished off with a dinner catered by The Coastal Kitchen. What this evening demonstrated was the impact that our plastic waste is having on the environment around the club. We plan to have some activity next year to help reduce our impact on the environment so please look out for details.

At this point I would like to thank my Executive for all their support this season. I truly believe that the decisions we have made and the initiatives we have developed are in the best interests of the future of all sections of Mount Martha Life saving Club.

I would also like to congratulate all of our award winners at our recent Thank You & Awards night. All very deserving recipients and a special congratulations to Grant & Bec Gibbs for receiving Life Membership - very well deserved for the commitment you have both given to the club over the years.

Again I would like to thank my family for their support. Pam, Hannah and Lucy have been a huge help to me in addition to their own volunteer roles within the club - I couldn't have done it without you.

I look forward to seeing you all around the club over the next year.



Thank you to our Icebergers, patrollers and schools program lifeguards for rolling out the matting and bringing it back in - sometimes at very short notice! This season I have taken on a couple of extra tasks which contribute to our requirements of achieving our Club Administration Grant from LSV. I believe these are accountable and thought it unfair to put pressure on our volunteers, so each week I now input all of our patrol logs and I undertook the preparation and printing of our Annual Report. I have also worked closely with our membership team chasing up Working with Children Checks which although it is something so simple it sometimes proved to be very difficult. We do not accept any new member applications without a valid WWCC which lists MMLSC & LSV. Working at the club during the week enables me to organise routine maintenance ie lift maintenance, fire equipment checks, food safety inspections etc which minimizes the time that our volunteers have to give up and being there on a Saturday morning means that club members can call in with queries. As often the first point of contact with new members I am passionate about promoting our club, its benefits and the diversity of the different groups we have and what we have to offer. I look forward to another great season in 2018/19.

## Club Captain Report

What an enjoyable 2017/18 season it has been. The level of participation in training, competition and social events has increased significantly and I feel lucky to have been involved with these aspects of club life. This increased participation is largely due to the work of the Committee in identifying some causes of a recent decline in involvement of members and implementing strategies to address them.

Having well maintained lifesaving craft helps greatly in conducting effective training sessions. It was interesting to note that it had been close to 10 years since the club made a substantial purchase of new competition equipment. Prior to the start of the season an inventory was taken of competition equipment and a sale was held to rid us of our aging boards and skis. A purchase was then made of 10 Nipper Boards and 4 Senior Boards. With some repair work, it was considered that the Skis were satisfactory to meet our needs, but 5 new carbon paddles were required. In response to feedback from members that there was little novice equipment available, a purchase was made of 6 Stand Up Paddle boards that are suitable for beginners, and I am pleased to report these boards have been very well utilised. It is planned that in coming seasons we will make smaller yearly purchases of new craft to ensure we maintain a good standard of equipment. Under the supervision of Keith Hunter, the maintenance and storage of craft has been greatly improved. Providing better access has made it much easier to get gear on to the beach and has also helped reduce damage to craft.

In recent years the number of our Senior participants has gradually declined, this was identified by the committee as an area that needed urgent attention. The future of the club is very dependent on a strong Seniors group as they play a vital role in Patrols, assistance with Nippers and in becoming mentors for junior members coming through. We were extremely fortunate to recruit Troy Cochrane back to the club this season as a Specialist Coach to assist Coach Shane Dawson, and Seniors Manager Lisa Chambers. Together they have provided a high-level program that has resulted in increased participation and some good results in competition and because of their efforts, I believe that the seniors are now truly heading in the right direction.

We have also seen growth in our Master group this year, with Wednesday night training regularly having over 15 participants. Following the departure of long-time coach Scott Fifield, Sarah Hilli took the reigns as Masters Manager and coordinated different coaches throughout the season, this model worked very well and provided a nice variation in training routines. The Social side of Masters has also grown, with regular after training sunset dinners held on the balcony, it was so nice to be able to use our great facility for this purpose. As always, the Masters Carnival in Lorne was a terrific weekend away, in competition we were delighted to place Third overall. There has been strong interest expressed in participating in Lorne next year and I am confident of even better results then. I would encourage anyone who has not been involved in Lifesaving in the past to give Masters a go, we cater for all levels in a very inclusive, non-threatening way. The Masters program will continue through the winter months, with Vanessa Wootton again running Wednesday night Pilates, be sure to watch the website for further updates.

One of my personal highlights of the season was the reintroduction of Masters vs Seniors competition. It was a perfect night of weather and fantastic good spirited competition run by the always entertaining Andrew and Loretta Felsing. It was fantastic to see so many participants, but a shame that due to several unfortunate factors, the Seniors were victorious by the smallest of margins, watch out next year.

**It has been a pleasure being involved in the Club as it's Captain over the past 2 years and I have really enjoyed getting to know many members better, I think we have a bright future to look forward to.**

## Chief Instructor Report

During the season we welcomed 46 new patrolling members plus members up skilling throughout the season - we added 14 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (AID), 46 Provide First Aid, 9 Inflatable Rescue Boat Crew, 3 Inflatable Rescue Boat Drivers, 3 Spinal Management, 4 Basic Beach Management, 31 ATV Induction and 10 Training Officers Certificate. Of the 4 years I have been Chief Instructor I have found this season the most challenging - with the cancellation of all water activities by LSV early December 2017 due to water quality which impacted hugely on our bronze/src assessment day as well as skills maintenance scheduled for this weekend. Re-scheduling of the assessments were finally completed by early January.

**I'm pleased that we have new enthusiastic members stepping up to become trainers within our club** - from starting out 4 years ago we had 2 trainers and we now have 14.

I would like to thank our trainers and assessors especially Vanessa Wootton & David Mowat for all of their help, support and enthusiasm. It is also great to work with other Peninsula clubs and I thank David Stogdale from Gunnamatta SLSC for his support with our IRB courses and Sue & Nick Archbold from Mornington LSC with their always there to help attitude. I have also enjoyed working with Amelia Sanchez & Deb Lowe from LSV & thank them for their support over the years with my role, my questions and all of the paperwork. Moving forward LSV have introduced a training ipad which should minimise the amount of paperwork that is **required for each training course which I'm sure will make the role easier.**

## First Aid Report

Over the past 2 seasons there have been quite a few subtle but important changes involving the first-aid room. These have been finalised and are working well during the past patrol season.

**Some of these changes include the introduction of the 2 'resus kits'. These 'kits' are made up of** equipment which is vital in managing the resuscitation of a patient. We now have a mobile kit in the ATV for all patrols which makes it possible for the club to conduct a full resuscitation with adequate equipment anywhere along the stretch of our beach.

Our 2 first aid kits have been updated and stocked with equipment capable of treating a patient with the same standard as we would in the first aid room. A third first aid kit will be purchased and stocked for use at events and carnivals.

My vision for the future is to make it a space that everyone feels comfortable to be in. I know we currently have maybe 1 or 2 patrol members from each team who we rely on when an incident occurs. Through further voluntary in-house training, quickly accessible prompt sheets, discussion around real life cases (plus more), I hope that everyone will feel comfortable and confident enough to deal with any medical incident that occurs at the club.

I would encourage anyone with ideas or thoughts on the operation of the first aid room, or areas for improvement to be made, please contact me at any time.

# Gear Steward (Competition) Report

In 2017/18 our main issues were:-

## 1. Storage of Equipment

**In the equipment room area, the installation of shelving, a storage rack for 6 new SUP's, 2 x flag containers & lockers has resulted in the storage space being insufficient to store and have access to all board racks. When all board racks are in the equipment room, as is the case now, members cannot gain access to the boards. As such, safe and damage free access and movement of the equipment is impossible. The storage of 2 x board racks in the patrol room during the season was greatly appreciated and provided a sensible and practicable solution to the effective management of the clubs equipment whilst access to all patrol equipment was maintained. The Committee and stakeholders needs to address the options available for the storage of club equipment.**

## 2. Equipment Management

**In the off season, an audit of all the boards, SUPS, Ski's, paddles etc will occur. A number of repairs will be required and some equip will no doubt be retired. I plan to place an order for parts (knee pads, hand grips etc) ASAP - this can only occur after I can gain access to the boards. A stock number will be written on every item so that we may have a better tracking system than what we have now. For instance, when a SUP is taken out, the SUP and the paddle needs to be recorded on the log and hopefully, the borrower and the patrol person will be more aware of what is going out and what needs to be returned. Building member awareness as to the correct care and use of equipment is ongoing. A few boards were damaged due to being left in the hot sun - top up - bubbles in the boards resulted. A number of new boards, nipper and senior, paddles and SUP's were obtained during the year. Jon should provide the actual data.**

## 3. Equipment Repairs and Retirements

**A number of boards, nippers & seniors, Ski's and a rescue board were repaired during the season along with 5 x SUP paddles. One SUP paddle disappeared. All the equip was repaired in house except for 9 boards that were taken to Oke for repair - one board was considered by them as unrepairable and as such has been retired. One mal is currently being repaired and requires a new knee pad from Bennett's. Additional items will be required from Bennett's and an order will be placed once the equipment audit is done. A number of boards and Ski's at the club require repairs and these will be done during the quiet time.**
