

Membership was very successful this year with a total of 1052 members to be processed, 352 new members and 700 re-joining, over the 2022-2023 season. This is a huge task for our membership team, and I would like to thank our subcommittee and Lauren, our administrator, for their hard work. There was only one option of Active Membership this year, which we understand can be daunting for busy families, but this is an important aspect of our club run by volunteers who also have full time jobs and families – we need to share the load. Many people rose to the challenge and have become more involved via their active roles, and I know most would say their families have enjoyed this far more than they ever expected and built a wonderful support network within the community. Evidence has shown that people who volunteer are happier and have improved mental health, so the benefit is mutual, and we always appreciate your contribution! Active roles are here to stay so please consider your role for next season and, if at any point you are unsure, reach out to the membership team and we can point you in the right direction. The exec and committee are always happy to help and support.

We also introduced our reduced membership rate for patrollers this season. Patrol is our core purpose, and our beach goers rely on us, so please consider doing a Bronze, SRC or ART course (there is usually a course suitable for most abilities and all training is supported by MMLSC/LSV) and joining one of our patrol teams for next season.

This year has seen the arrival of our two beautiful new Pride lifesaving boards from Life Saving Victoria helping us raise awareness of LGBTQIA+ members in lifesaving and across all sports. We also had our Pride patrol, which was run by patrol captain, Ruby Lines-Perrier, where we enjoyed rainbow cupcakes and flew our rainbow flag high to spread the message that anyone is welcome at our club. On Sunday 5th February, three members, including myself, also attended the Midsummer Pride March in St Kilda as part of LSV and marched proudly alongside other emergency service personnel who are passionate about Inclusion. This was an incredible experience which we will be repeating so please contact me if you are interested in joining next year. We also held our first Safe Talk workshop run by Mick Simmons at Mental Health Safety Net which focuses on suicide prevention. Twelve members attended this talk, funded by the club, and found it very engaging and informative. We will collaborate further in future with this charity.

Patrol Captain Report Lucy Mowat

I would like to thank each and every one of our patrollers that volunteered their time to help keep our beach safe this season. Your efforts do not go unnoticed, the community and MMLSC are grateful for your commitments.

The 2022/23 patrol season kicked off with our first ever Captains' Patrol. Patrol team captains, vice captains, emerging patrol leaders and our life saving operations team attended the day. We have introduced this initiative to help us ensure that all team captains and vice captains are up to date with new processes introduced by LSV, it also helps to make sure that each team is operating in similar ways.

This season saw LSV introduce the Low Patronage Patrol (LPP) initiative to the Pre-Peak and Post-Peak periods. An LPP patrol can be triggered on days where the weather forecast is below 22 degrees and not during the peak season. This initiative means that only two patrollers need to patrol, because the poor weather and time of year mean that our beach attendance will be low. Our teams used the LPP initiative during March and April of this patrol season. We've found that it works perfectly for our patrol teams and ensures that our volunteers' commitment reflects the needs of the community.

A special thanks to the trainers and assessors who helped qualify, upskill, and re-qualify our patrollers this season, without you we wouldn't be able to help keep our beach safe. This season our trainers and assessors qualified 4 new SRCs, upskilled 7 SRCs to their Bronze Medallion, and qualified 19 new Bronzies. We also had lots of patrollers upskill by attaining new awards. This season our trainers and assessors qualified 9 new IRB Crewpersons, 5 IRB Drivers, 6 new SSV Operators, 13 new ARTFA awards and 3 Silver Medallion Patrol Captains. The Silver Medallion Patrol Captain award was introduced this season to ensure that patrol team captains are equipped to handle complex scenarios that may arise whilst on patrol. The 2022/23 patrol season spanned 26 weeks, 67 patrols, and 3,835 patrol hours completed by 152 volunteer lifesavers. We struggled with poor water quality and weather conditions in the beginning of the season. Thankfully the weather improved in time for Christmas, and we had a great run of weather for most of the season. This season our total recorded beach attendance was 161,830 and our patrollers recorded five rescues. Overall, MMLSC had a successful patrol season.

Thank you again to all of the life savers that volunteered their time to keep our beach safe this season. See you on the beach!

Mount Martha Life Saving Club's Training, Assessment and Facilitators (TAF) team have supported our members this season with many opportunities to gain new awards and update current awards through skills maintenance sessions.

The season began with a combined Bronze Medallion (BM), Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and Bronze Medallion Bridging (BMB) Course – what a way to begin! This was the first season of the new BMB course, with 8 members upskilling from SRC to Bronze. In addition, we welcomed 12 new Bronze award holders and 4 new SRCs. Congratulations to them all! This course involved many of our TAF team and we thank them all for their time, skills, and dedication during training and assessment of the candidates.

This was only the beginning of a big season for the TAF team. The team also ran 2 IRB driver & crew courses, 6 Resuscitation courses, 1 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques & First Aid (ARTFA) course and 2 Side by Side Vehicle courses.

Additionally, to this, the team ran 6 skills maintenance sessions from October through to end December including our ever-popular session for our Seniors group. These covered all awards (SRC, Bronze, IRB crew & driver and ART). Unfortunately, due to the poor water quality we were unable to complete the water components before the end of December 2022. LSV extended the re-qualification period for current award holders until the end of January 2023, so we held a further 2 sessions to ensure everyone's awards were current.

Please take care when handling skis, SUPs and boards. Get assistance with the task and ensure your access to and from the storage rack is clear.

The club has placed orders for boards and ski's and with luck, they will be available at the start of the next season.

All club members are very fortunate to have available to them an assortment of water craft and boards. I repeat = The golden rules for looking after equipment: -

- 1. Do not leave boards face up in the hot sun turn upside down.
- 2. Do not drag boards over sand / rocks
- 3. Get help to carry boards etc out off and back into the racks, A lot of damage occurs when handling them in the confined spaces of our club rooms,
- 4. Take care when loading / unloading and strapping boards onto cars / trailers
- 5. Report any damage to equipment to patrol captains and place a "do not use" tag on the equipment and store it at the back of the equip room
- 6. Take care of the equipment and only use the equipment for the purpose it was designed for.
- 7. Do not stand or sit on a board when it is on the sand.

Summary

Another good year. Great to see nippers and new members of various ages learning how to use the water equipment.

During the winter months, the boards and ski's will be checked and repairs carried out. Special thanks to Steve Hofer for helping with the board makeovers and repairs.
